A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION OFFERED AS A MEMORIAL FOR RICHARD MANCINI

WHEREAS, It is with deep respect for the memory of Richard Mancini that we offer this resolution as a memorial to his life. Mr. Mancini, a Sterling Heights-based contractor, left his imprint on the infrastructures of two states as a builder of roads, sewers, industrial parks, and shopping centers; and

WHEREAS, The president and CEO of Ric-Man Construction, Inc., and owner of Ledds Development Company, Mr. Mancini was responsible for numerous projects in both Michigan and Florida, including sections of the I-696 freeway and Metro Airport since becoming involved in the construction business in 1968; and

WHEREAS, Richard Mancini's career involved spending a great deal of time out of doors, yet, even when not working, there were few places he would rather have been. He loved Northern Michigan and the beauty and the bounty of all this state's lands and waters. He was a member of the Grosse Pointe Yacht Club, the Clinton River Boat Club, and the Yacht and Racquet Club of Boca Raton, Florida; and

WHEREAS, While his time on earth was short, only fifty-six years, Richard Mancini always gave the best of himself in all endeavors. For that he will long be remembered by his wife, Gilda, and his children, Lisa, David, Steven, Daniel, and Edward. To them we express our deepest condolences; now, therefore, be it
